

## *Bob Corbo*



**B**ob Corbo, who has spent most of his adult years working with the youth of Norwalk as a coach, manager, and administrator, will be among the eight Norwalkers and one Wiltonite who will be honored at the annual Norwalk Old Timers dinner this year.

Corbo has been associated with the Calvin Murphy Bidy League for 20 years, as a commissioner, coach, and referee. He is currently a commissioner and player agent for the Senior Babe Ruth League with which he has been involved for nine years.

His coaching has also encompassed the Darien Junior High School, the Norwalk Church League, and Cranbury Little League.

Bob has been active in the Norwalk Old Timers organization for many years, serving as its president for two years, vice president for two years, and secretary for two years, while serving as a member of various committees. Bob has often acted as master of ceremonies for the annual Old Timers banquets.

He was the organizer of the first Calvin Murphy Day in Norwalk following Murphy's graduation from Niagara University, and he served on the committee for the Calvin Murphy Day earlier this year.

As a participant, Bob played basketball with the Ranger AC in the City Recreation League, as well as the H.D. Catty Corporation team in the City League with Vic D'Amato and Larry Anastasia.

In 1976 Bob coached the Greenwich Central Junior High School boys basketball team to an undefeated season and a Fairfield County championship, and in 1972 he coached the Calvin Murphy Bidy League all-star team to a state championship.

Bob was born in Stamford but grew up in the Woodward Avenue area of South Norwalk. He is a graduate of Norwalk High School and the University of Connecticut. He holds a Sixth Year Degree in Public Administration. After two years in the Air Force, he has spent 32 years as a public school teacher in Darien and Greenwich. Currently, he is an administrator in the Greenwich school system.
