

Mauro (Mac) Bossone



Mauro (Mac) Bossone was one of Norwalk's steadiest baseball players in the period from the 1920s through the 1930s. An outstanding hitter, Mac was a fixture at third base on most of the top baseball teams of the two decades during which he was active.

He started with the Laurels in the early '20s, and finished up with them just before the start of World War II. In the interim, he played with and against some of the greats of the period, donning uniforms of Wilton, the Springwood Nationals who traveled mostly in eastern New York State, Mianus, the top-rated Norwalks, St. John's, and Rowayton Hose Co.

Mac played with Skeet Watson's Norwalks, the first team to play night ball in Norwalk.

He played hockey with the Rowayton Hose and the Crystal Rink All Stars, coached the Traendley Roses girls softball team, and has been an avid tennis buff since his youth.

Mac and his wife, the former Elvera Angione, have two children.
